Cesar, a lover of all breeds of dogs, puts forth the ideas that we as a society need to stop fearing pit bulls but instead encourage better training, of both dogs and humans, to get a handle on the image and the reality of these dogs, and bring them back to being well loved instead of reviled.

He also takes time in this special to examine the legislation being pushed in some parts of the country to ban ownership of pit bulls.
